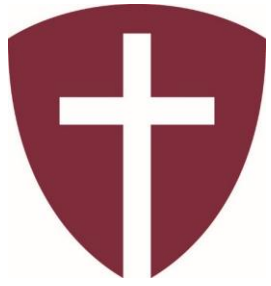
Children attend whole school liturgical prayer each Monday and Key Stage liturgical prayer on a Wednesday.

Year 4 Curriculum: Maths

Multiplication Check:

- The Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) is a Key Stage 2 assessment to be taken by pupils at the end of Year 4, in June.
- It is an online test where the children are asked 25 randomly generated questions on times tables 2 to 12. For every question, the children have 6 seconds to answer, and in between the questions, there is a 3-second rest.

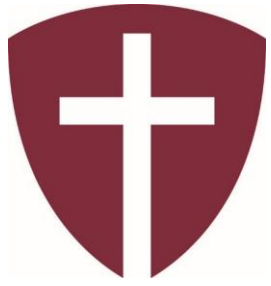




Year 4 Reading

It is important that children read daily at home as this will help develop your child's fluency. Please ask your child questions about what they have read to check their understanding. Class teachers can provide questions examples if you are unsure what to ask.

Please make sure that reads are recorded in the reading journals. Reading journals are expected to be in school daily but will be checked every Wednesday along with their home learning. Children may write a comment in their reading journals if they wish to, but we ask you to please initial their comment.



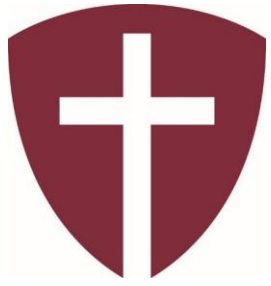
Year 4 Homework

TT Rockstars – Logins will be shared in due course.

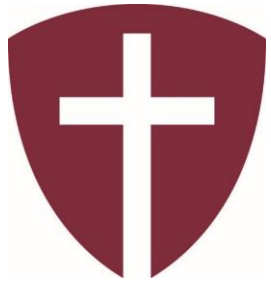
Grammar and **Maths** homework will be set on Fridays and due the following Wednesday.

Nut Allergies

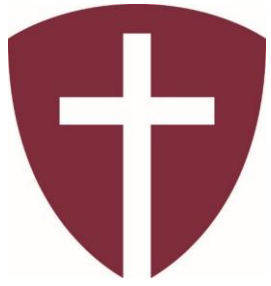

Please may children who wish to use the den building or forest school areas during lunch times bring named wellies or old shoes in a named bag. These will be kept in school on the children's pegs.

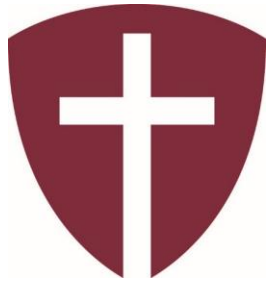


School Uniform

Our uniform policy can be found on the school website www.stcharlesprimary.uk > Policies > Uniform Policy.

Children are not allowed to wear jewellery in school due to health and safety concerns. The exceptions to this rule is a sensible wrist watch/basic fitness tracker that does not allow connection to a smartphone device.

Only simple, plain headbands or hairclips are to be worn in school. No makeup or nail varnish is to be worn in school. Children with long hair should ensure that it is tied back during the school day.



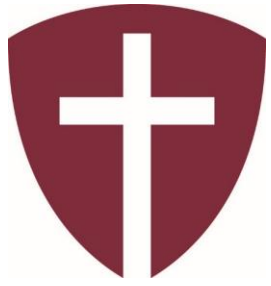
Attendance

Regular attendance and punctuality are vital for good progress and we expect all children's attendance to be 97% and above.

Attendance is shown as a percentage figure and we have detailed research below that shows how attendance, even at this early stage of education, affects outcomes for children at GCSE. We hope the tables below illustrate for you the importance of good attendance; this includes avoiding taking holidays during term time.

If your child had less than 97% attendance, we would urge you to ensure their attendance improves this year.

How Attendance affects GCSE Achievement	
% attendance	Percentage achieving 5 A*-C GCSEs
100 – 93.5%	74.3%
93.4 – 92.5%	60.4%
92.4 – 91.5%	53.1%
91.4 – 90%	44.6%
89.9 – 88%	34.7%
Less than 88%	26.7%



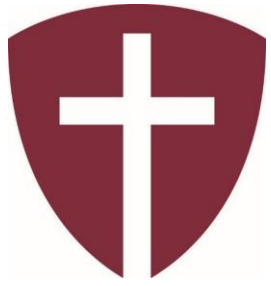
Supporting Your Child in Year 4

Online Safety

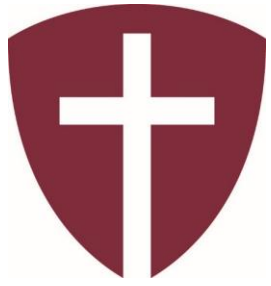
We use Netsweeper to protect children when they use the internet in school.

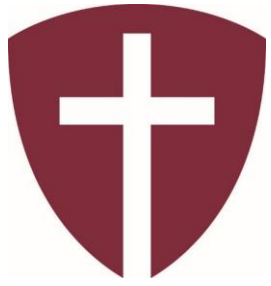
