




Reading in Nursery — What it looks like




- Environmental sounds (listening skills)



End of Year Expectations — Early Learning Goal — Reading

Word Reading

- -Say a sound for each letter in the alphabet and at least 10 digraphs;
- -Read words consistent with their phonic knowledge by sound blending;
- -Read aloud simple sentences and books that are consistent with their phonic knowledge, including some common exception words.

Comprehension

- -Demonstrate understanding of what has been read to them by retelling stories and narratives using their own words and recently introduced vocabulary;
- -Anticipate where appropriate key events in stories
- -Use and understand recently introduced vocabulary during discussions about stories, non-fiction, rhymes and poems and during role-play.



Reading Books



- Support children to spot and blend the sounds in words and recognise red words
- Discuss story and characters to support comprehension skills
- Ask retrieval questions to support children's understanding

Supporting Your Child At Home - Reading

- Read lots of stories to your child discuss stories to support comprehension skills.
- Link pictures and text together.
- Spot sounds and words in the environment and read together.
- Play I spy /robot talk games / listening walks.
- Share school reading books together It helps children to read the same book a number of times to build fluency.
- Practise sounds in sound book.
