# **Key Stage 1 News**

Year 1 have loved looking at spirals in Art, creating some beautiful drawings of shells using watercolours and oil pastels. We really enjoyed writing instructions for the Gingerbread Man in English, using imperative verbs to tell him what to do. Year 2 have really enjoyed writing a poem based on the Owl and the Pussy Cat this term. They have enjoyed being scientists whilst investigating the best habitat for bugs and enjoyed learning about Neil Armstrong during Space Week.

# **Key Stage 2 News**

Year 4 had a fantastic trip to the Centre for Life where they explored the different zones, watched an amazing 'Fire and Ice' Science Show and learnt all about the constellations in the Planetarium. They also completed a brilliant 'Discovering Chemistry' workshop where they used real laboratory equipment to test different chemicals, change them from liquid to solid and see what colour flames they made in a Bunsen burner! In their writing sessions this half-term, Year 6 have been building up to writing a horror narrative based on the stimulus, 'Francis Brandywine'. The children have written character descriptions, setting descriptions and built suspense using a range of grammatical features that they have learnt so far, this half-term. The narratives have been gripping!

## **Faith in Action Award: Pin Award**

Year 6 wanted to thank everyone who joined us for our welcome breakfast earlier this half-term. Their next events will be raising money for all those affected by the Gaza-Israeli conflict. In November, Year 6 will be leading a remembrance liturgy for KS2 and for the Year 6 parents.
