St Charles' Borromeo



He worked hard at school and studied Law. He moved to Rome and worked at the Vatican. His uncle was Pope at the time. He donated all of his money to the poor. He used his leadership skills in the Vatican to promote learning. He decided that the Lord was calling him to the priesthood. And so, he became a priest, then a bishop and then he became the Archbishop of Milan in 1564.

When he died, he was named as a saint because of all the work he did to improve Churches and help the poor.
